

LEGAL CUSTODY

2. If a parent is awarded sole legal custody they shall confer with and seek input from the other parent who was not awarded legal custody, and if the parents are awarded joint legal custody, or before the entry of a Family Court Judgment they shall agree, before making any final decisions on issues affecting the growth and development of the children; including, but not limited to, choice of religious upbringing, choice of child care provider, choice of school, course of study, special tutoring, extracurricular activities, including but not limited to, music, art, dance and other cultural lessons or activities and gymnastics or other athletic activities, choice of camp or other comparable summer activity, non-emergency medical and dental treatment, psychological, psychiatric or like treatment or counseling, the choice of particular health care providers, the extent of any travel away from home, part or full-time employment, purchase or operation of a motor vehicle, contraception and sex education, and decisions relating to actual or potential litigation on behalf of the child. However, each parent may make decisions regarding the day-to-day care and control of the children and in emergencies affecting the health and safety of the children while the child are residing with him or her. The parents shall endeavor, whenever reasonable, to be consistent in such day-to-day decisions.
